



About Summerfield School

Summerfield Residential & Day School was founded in the year 1987 as it was felt that there was the need to establish in a rural area, an institution that would provide quality public school pattern education. With the blessings of our founder Chairmen Late Dr. Dwijen Sen, the school proudly celebrated 25 years of its existence in 2012. 20 batches of class X students and 7 batches of class XII students have passed out successfully bringing laurels to this institution. Students of Summerfield are doing well for themselves in the fields of Medicine, Engineering, Armed Forces, Industry and Services in India and abroad.

The school is located in sylvan surroundings on the western edge of the Doon Valley tucked between the Garhwal Himalayas in the North and the Shivalik ranges in the south. The school is located on NH 123, 36 km from Dehradun railway station. The river Yamuna, in all its sparkling glory, flows 1.5km from the school. The hill stations of Mussoorie and Chakrata are in close proximity.

The Bravehearts and Veerangana hostels for boys and girls house besides civilians, about 100 sons and daughters of the martyred, disabled, serving and retired soldiers of Indian Defence Services and Paramilitary Forces.

School Managing Committee

Our students come from very diverse backgrounds. Our challenge as well as our pleasure lies in grooming our students into young men and women who are sure of themselves and their abilities. In the process of preparing them, we employ micro teaching methods where the specific short comings and weaknesses of each student are dealt withwith a lot of hard work, understanding and love. In an unthreatened healthy atmosphere, each student knows that he has something special within him. Teaching for us is not only about books, note books and the drudgery of daily assignments and rote learning. Rather, learning is about being morally stable, culturally aware, emotionally positive and educationally competitive. The ultimate reward for us is that we see before us balanced individuals who can stand up to the competitive world and make a career for themselves, as well as work unabashedly with their hands. Our love and blessings remain with our students always.

1. EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

- The school is an English medium, Senior Secondary, co educational, residential and day school and is affiliated to the CBSE, New Delhi. Great emphasis is laid on classroom teaching which encourages brighter students to strive towards newer heights and the weaker ones to achieve the required academic standards. The school is open to all boys and girls irrespective of caste, creed or social status. The school at present has boarding facility only for boys from Classes I- XII.
- The system of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation CCE has been adopted in its true spirit to enhance the aptitude, attitude and ability of every student. The student teacher ratio 1: 17 and average strength of each class is 40.
- The school also provides 25% reservation to the underprivileged in the starter class as per the RTE 2009.
- The subjects offered at Senior Secondary level are English, Hindi, Economics, Business Studies, Accountancy, Physical Education, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics & Biology. The School has a well equipped library, laboratories, computer center and spacious classrooms.

















- The School functions on a tutorial system where, supervised and unsupervised extra work is given to the children on a need based requirement. A monthly assessment is carried out of each child individually, in order to ensure that the bright children are encouraged to do even better, and the weak are helped to achieve the required academic standards.
- Tests are conducted regularly in order to ascertain the assimilation of the children, and to identify the weak areas that may require special attention. In addition to Formative Assignment, Half Yearly and Final promotion examinations are held in September and March respectively.
- Great emphasis is laid on physical fitness, games and sports. It is our firm belief that, leadership qualities in young minds are forged on the games field. As a part of the school curriculum, all children have to take part in games and sports. Facilities exist for football, basketball, handball, cricket, athletics, badminton, yoga and martial arts.
- The School firmly believes that through delegation of responsibility and authority, leadership qualities develop in children. Accordingly, the School functions on a House System and the House Staff and Prefects are responsible for discipline, and conduct of many day to day functions of the school.
- Dignity of labour, community and social work form an important part of our ethos. In order to inculcate these habits in the children from an early age, they are required to maintain their dormitories and toilets, look after the school campus, maintain the garden and work in the dining hall.

2. CO- CURRICULAR LITERARY AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

India has a rich tradition of folk music, dance, arts and crafts. The students are constantly exposed to these art forms with a view to develop awareness of Indian heritage and culture. The school patronises the SPICMCAY which regularly sends world renowned artistes and performers of various classical music and dance forms to perform in the school. The students also bring to the stage various folk dance forms in an annual event called The Evening of Song and Dance. Besides this the students take keen interest in staging plays and conducting literary events like debate, declamation, recitation and public speaking. Exhibitions are held to display concepts and models pertaining to various subjects fabricated by the students themselves.

ADVENTURE/EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Being in the lap of nature and nestling at the foothills of the Himalayas provide ample scope for treks through the forests and mountains and leisurely picnics on the riverside. Holidays are spent exploring nature or else being taken on guided tours of various scientific research organizations and museums in the area.

3. DISCIPLINE

- The school does not permit corporal punishment as we believe that punishment should be corrective and not humiliating. The school has a Prefectorial system consisting of School Captain, House Captains and Prefects. Checks by these student appointments at the one level, and counseling and guidance by the teachers and the administration at the other, is effectively used to develop a collective responsibility towards maintenance of discipline in the school.
- Handling of large sums of money and keeping expensive belongings like mobile phones, iPod, cameras, gold items, expensive wrist watches etc, is not permitted. Parents are therefore advised not to give their children any valuables or money.
- The School Management reserves the right to remove from the institution any student found to be indulging in the following acts: Cheating, stealing, bullying/ragging, physical attack, self injury, attempt to leave school premises without permission, use of abusive language, unacceptable behavior towards opposite gender, use of tobacco/drugs/alcohol, disfiguring school property and/or any other act which is considered unacceptable. The decision of the School Discipline and Prevention of Harassment Committee will be final.

4. DAILY SCHOOL ROUTINE


- A typical working day commences at about 5.30 am with 30 minutes of Physical Training.
- The boys then dress up for the days' classes.
 Breakfast is followed by assembly. At assembly Day Scholars join the school.
- Normal School activity continues till 2 p.m.
 The Day Scholars then leave for the day.
- Mid day break for lunch is from 2 pm to 2.30 pm.
- This is followed by tutorial classes up to 4 p.m. During this period subject teachers help the children in their weak subjects.
- The children then play supervised games for an hour from 4.30pm to 5.30 pm. followed by refreshment of fruits & biscuits.
- After games the boarders bathe and dress up for the evening class.

















- Five days in a week there is a study period from 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm. Resident teachers are available to help the children with their studies at this time.
- Dinner is served at 8.15pm. The children are then free upto 9.30pm when the lights are switched off.
- Students are allowed out on supervised outings only.

5. BOARDING

DORMITORIES

The school has an independent aesthetically designed hostel complex which caters to the needs of the students for comfortable and gracious living. The students are well supervised and monitored by the residential staff. The dormitories are well laid out, adequately ventilated and conform to high standards of hygiene. The students take pride in cleaning and maintaining their dormitories themselves. Efficient barber and laundry facilities are integral to the School.

DAIRY

The school also has its own dairy which ensures a steady supply of pure milk and milk products to the children

GREEN ENERGY

The School relies on solar heating for a steady supply of hot water to the hostel complex.

FOOD

The school dining room and kitchen are equipped with modern appliances to enable hygienic and clean cooking. Wholesome and nutritious vegetarian diet, which caters to the dietary needs of the children is prepared and served under the strict supervision of the school administration.

MEDICAL SUPPORT

The school has on its panel a team of doctors consisting of a pediatrician, skin specialist, orthopedic surgeon, dentist and an ophthalmologist. The Herbertpur Christian Hospital, a multi specialty hospital at a distance of 0.5km, provides comprehensive medical and surgical cover.

6. VISITING RULES

Parents and local guardians of Boarders will be permitted to visit the children and take them out only if their photographs have been given to the school at the time of admission. Visiting hours are between 9.30am and 4 pm on Sundays and school holidays. Parents of newly admitted children will not be permitted to visit their children for six weeks after admission. New admissions must be given time to settle down. Parents are requested to note that the school does not have any guest rooms to accommodate out-station parents. Parents/guardians will have to call personally at the school office to visit or take their children out on out pass. Parents are requested not to enter classrooms, Mess or dormitories without the permission of the Management.

7. VACATIONS

There will be two vacations, one of 50 days duration from early May to last week of June and the other for 30 days in December- January.



8. REGISTRATION, ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE

Some seats are reserved for the children of our martyred, disabled, serving and retired soldiers in various classes, subject to availability at the start of the session.

Parents will at the time of submission of the admission form submit the following:

- a) Birth Certificate in original
- b) Report Card
- c) Transfer Certificate in original duly verified by the State Education Authority.
- d) Immunisation Certificate from the family doctor giving out the details with dates of injection/ inoculation/vaccinations, the child has been given.
- e) Army Educational Entitlement Card (if applicable)
- f) 4 Passport size & 2 (4x6inch) photographs of the child
- g) Agreement as per Performa duly executed by the parent/guardian on a non judicial stamp paper.
- h) Photographs of parents, local guardians and relatives permitted to visit the child
- i) Details of chronic ailments and medical treatment given to the child by the family doctor.
- j) Information regarding drug allergies.
- k) History of hereditary diseases e.g. diabetes, heart ailments, etc.

In order to help the school understand and help your child overcome adjustment and psychological problems, parents are required to give the following information. This information will be kept confidential:

- a) Any adjustment or psychological problems of the child.
- b) Domestic/emotional problems of the child and/ or parents
- c) Marital status of the parents (Please state if divorced and/or remarried)
- d) Drug related addiction of the child/parents
- e) Any other information

If a child is withdrawn from the School by the parent at any time during his stay at the school, the following rules shall apply:

- a) Notice of withdrawal should be given 60 days prior to the completion of the current term.
- b) If a child is withdrawn once the term has started, no refund of fee will be made on any ground whatsoever.
